

ELDERS CORNER

Simply Because It Is True

In today's world, it can feel like opinions often matter more than facts. But at the heart of the Christian faith is the simple, powerful idea of believing in Jesus because it's true. It's not about convenience, popularity, or personal comfort—it's about trusting the unchanging truth of His life, death, and resurrection.

The Apostle Paul puts it this way in 1 Corinthians 15:14: "And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith." That's a big statement, but it's true. If Jesus didn't rise from the dead, then everything about Christianity falls apart. The resurrection is the foundation of it all.

Sometimes, people think of faith as a personal preference, like picking a favorite dessert. But faith in Jesus isn't just about what feels good to us. It's about what's real. Either Jesus rose from the dead, or He didn't. There's no middle ground. If the resurrection is true, then everything Jesus said about Himself and about us matters deeply. His claim to be "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6) isn't just a comforting thought—it's reality.

Faith in Jesus isn't blind. It's grounded in historical evidence, personal stories, and the incredible ways God has worked throughout history. The empty tomb, the eyewitness accounts, and the transformation of countless lives all point to the truth of His resurrection.

So, why do you believe in Jesus? Let it be because it's true. Let the truth of His life, death, and resurrection shape every part of your life. As Paul reminds us, if the resurrection isn't true, then nothing else matters. But if it is true, then nothing else can compare.

1 Flooring in the Fellowship Hall

Altar Guild



We will soon be entering the second great division of the Church Year.
Lent, the time of preparation for Easter.

In the Early Church it was a period of preparation for the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, which would take place of the Vigil of Easter. This preparation included fasting and other spiritual disciplines.

The first section of this time is the season of Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, the exact date depends on the date of Easter, which this year Ash Wednesday is on March 5th and Easter is on April 20th. The name "Ash Wednesday" comes from a practice which originated in the Middle Ages of ashes being sprinkled over the heads of those who came to church and went to confession. Today, the ashes come from palms that were blessed on Palm Sunday the year before. Both this rite and traditional readings for the day call for an attitude of humility and repentance.

Lent consists of forty days of abstinence and fasting, excluding the Sundays in between, which are not Sundays of Lent but Sundays in Lent. There are five Sundays in Lent. The fourth Sunday is called Laetare, which means "rejoice." This Sunday was introduced to relieve some of the rigors of observing the Lenten fast, it can be considered the anticipation of the joy of Easter. This season continues until the eve of Palm Sunday.

The color for Lent is blue, symbolizing sorrow and repentance. Because of the mood of Lent is subdued, ornamentation in addition to the parametrs and standard appointments (flowers etc.) is inappropriate.


We have such a special group of kids that love to include all their friends of all ages! I am excited to see what the rest of the year brings for Sunday School.

On March 17, 2025 we will host the Annual Prayer Service at Good Shepherd.






Gail Johnson has given us many quilt tops and backings for us to finish. Because of this we will never run out of work.
